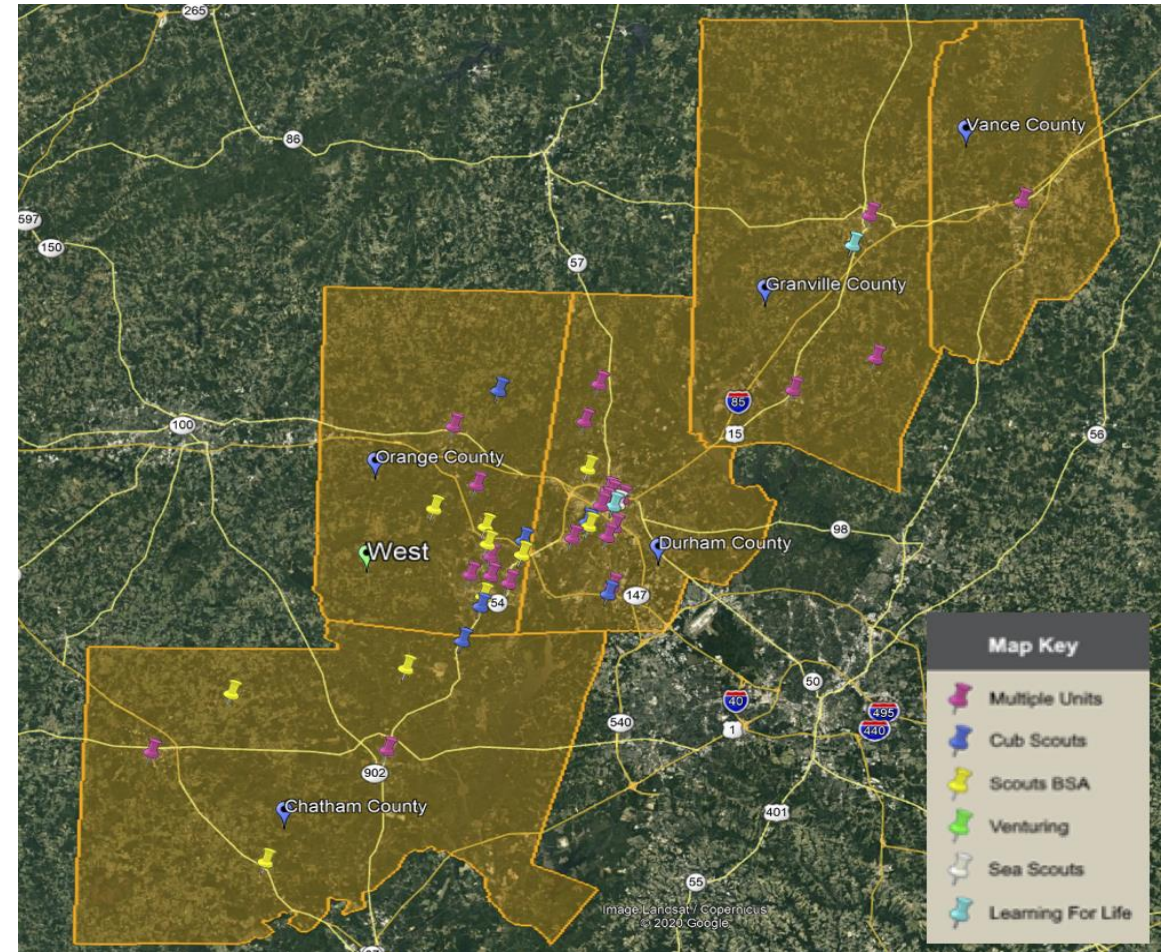

Restart Scouting Checklist

As always, the safety of our Scouts, volunteers, employees and contractors is our top priority. The checklist outlines several essential reopening guidelines that local leaders/charterers must consider while working with local and state health departments, local schools, chartered organizations and Scouting leaders on when and how to resume meetings, service projects, camping and all other official Scouting activities.

If it is not practical to meet these national protocols, do not conduct in-person activities.

S = Supervision

- Understand local and state guidance on preventing COVID-19 exposure.
- Engage your chartered organization and local council on necessary adjustments.
- Conduct the "before you gather" protocols.

A = Assessment

- Identify participants who fall under the CDC's group of higher-risk individuals. Notify all participants about the risks of participating since COVID-19 exposure cannot be eliminated.
- Verify that the planned activity, gathering or group sizes are not prohibited by local or state orders.

F = Fitness and Skill

- Review Annual Health and Medical Records and consider using a pre-event screening

SAFE ≠ Risk-Free

As the response to the pandemic shifts to a multi-phased, phased approach, the Boy Scouts of America advises local councils to consult with their local and state health departments, as well as local chartered partners, to implement appropriate protocols to help keep our members, volunteers and employees safe.

Precautions and mitigation strategies are important, but they cannot eliminate the potential for exposure to COVID-19 or any other illness when in-person activities resume.

People with COVID-19 may show no signs or symptoms of illness, but they can spread the virus. Some people may be contagious before their symptoms occur. The fact is that someone with COVID-19 may pass the required health screenings, and be allowed into program activities.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) states that older adults and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions are at higher risk for severe illness.

Campfires are a powerful part of the outdoor experience.

- They can be lively with laughter, storytelling, and fellowship.
- The campfire can also be a time of reflection, learning, and great peace.
- Safe behavior around a campfire ensures a good time can be had by all while mitigating the inherent danger of the fire.

Some helpful reminders:

Smart behaviors around a campfire

- Fires are useful, but they can be dangerous. Always respect a fire by showing smart behaviors.
- Stay outside of the campfire ring. Do not touch any part of the fire ring once the fire has been lit.
- Don't run, jump, or play around campfires. Understand that fires can cause injuries.
- "Once it's in, it stays in." Don't pull anything out of the campfire.

Maintain a safe campfire and campsite

- Always consider the campfire's surroundings.
- Ensure the campfire is the appropriate distance between the seating areas and tents.
- Verify federal and local regulations regarding fire bans and policies.

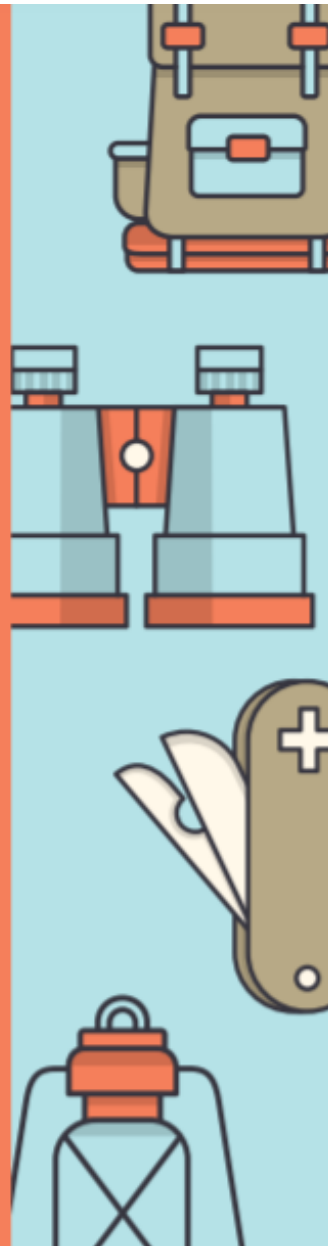

Internet Charter Renewal 2.0 (Preview)

- **Major re-write of Internet Recharter**
- **Significant differences in both appearance and process from previous online recharter system**
- **New system focused on recharter only**
 - Old system had 5 stages
 - New system has 2 stages
 - Some functions removed from recharter tool
 - Removed functions already available in other My.Scouting tools

Prepared. For Life.®





Internet Charter Renewal 2.0 (Preview)

- Access system using My.Scouting Tools login
- No unit recharter codes
- Unit key 3 and key 3 delegates have access
- System intended to be paperless
- New online signature process using Adobe Sign
- Missing documents (e.g. new applications, CBC forms, YPT certificates) should be scanned and uploaded to the charter renewal system
- Online payment options mostly unchanged (but strongly discouraged in this council)

- Unit access begins on traditional schedule (60 days prior) not October 15
